Executive Summary

Six Nations Elected Council headed by the Consultation Accommodation Process team implemented engagement sessions with Six Nations community members to inform them of the McKenzie Meadows Development, located in Caledonia. The project being proposed is a numbered company owned by Michael Corrado and others. Engagement sessions were held on Tuesday November 5th, at Six Nations Tourism, Saturday November 16th, at Six Nations Polytechnic and Thursday November 21st, at the Six Nations Community Hall.

The focus of the engagement process was to gauge the community's response and support the community of the McKenzie Meadows Development.

"Caledonia Development - Standing Strong, Prospering Together", along with "It's Our Community's Future, Let's Talk About it", were utilized to encourage the community to participate throughout the engagement process.

The accommodation benefits being presented to the community included:

- \$1,250.00 per residential unit will be paid to a dedicated purpose account for the construction of Kawennio/Gaweniyo Private School. With a minimum of 700 residential units up to a maximum of 1000 being proposed, the total proposed benefits could reach up to \$1,250,000.00.
- The developer will work with SNEC to present employment opportunities where practicable to qualified SN members. The developer will work with SNEC to conduct a one-day Job Fair in Six Nations for each Phase of the project.
- This was creating a precedent in establishing an accommodation template for residential and commercial developments throughout the Haldimand Treaty Lands wherein Six Nations would share in the developers revenues on an interim basis until our 1995 litigation is resolved; our claims settled and or our Treaties honoured by Canada and Ontario.
- This would have also established a new mechanism to have lands returned to Six Nations.

With this in mind, every participant was asked to answer one basic question:

1) Do you support this project?

In total, 79 people attended the engagement sessions and final community meeting. The participants provided input through comment cards or spoke with CAP team members individually. Information and comment cards were mailed to community members and advertised through radio ads, the Turtle Island News and Two Row Times. The same information was posted online at the sixnationsfuture.ca website.

To date, a total of 71 responses were received, 24 of those responses came in after the November 28th deadline. 56 comment cards were filled in, 13 online comments

were written, 1 phone call asking questions about the development and 1 undecided comment card.

12 - Support Project

54 - Oppose Project

3 - Non-community members

1 - Undecided

Community members welcomed the opportunity to provide input and were thoughtful in their responses. The CAP team handled a wide range of views, questions and concerns pertaining to the community, the land and its future. Participants were eager to voice their concerns and expressed an interest in hearing the final results.

Many community members were skeptical regarding the McKenzie Meadows Development, concerns were based on their past experiences not reflecting a true response of the communities voice. Several participants also expressed concern that their time and feedback would not be valued. It was suggested that visiting all Six Nations residents door-to-door would provide an accurate voice and fair decision. It was also suggested that any positive or negative actions as a result of the engagement process be shared with the entire community.

Background

A numbered company owned by Michael Corrado and others started a Court Application seeking an anticipatory injunction against Haudenosaunee Confederacy Chiefs Council (HCCC), Haudenosaunee Development Institute (HDI), Six Nations Elected Council (SNEC) and all members of the Six Nations of the Grand River in order to prevent any protests or work stoppages at the development. To oppose the application, both the SNEC and the HCCC responded to the court action. The matter was never litigated but legal counsel for all parties engaged in and arrived at a Mediated Settlement of the application. Six Nations would not have been involved, however there had to be a response by SNEC because of the court proceeding.

As a result of the impending development, it was recommended by the Haudenosaunee Development Institute and the Six Nations Elected Council that any benefits as result of this development would go towards Kawennio/Gaweniyio Private School building costs. A tentative settlement was arrived at in which the development could go ahead if the Six Nations Community approved the terms of the proposed Accommodation Agreement. This process could have developed an accommodation template for residential developments within the Haldimand Tract without prejudice to our 1995 court case or Treaty Rights.

Six Nations Elected Council passed a motion to begin the community engagement process to gauge community support for the McKenzie Meadows Development. On behalf of the SNEC the CAP team began the engagement process to determine if the Six Nations of the Grand River community members were interested supporting the development and benefits going towards the Kawennio/Gawen:yo Private School.

As a result of the legal process a 30-day window between October 28, 2013 and November 28, 2013, the CAP team set out to implement a process that would encourage community participation and provide various opportunities for community members to voice their views and concerns.

The CAP teams goal; was to make a best-concerted effort to reach as many Six Nations community members as possible within the timeline provided.

Methodology

The following methods were used to promote community awareness of the McKenzie Meadows Development:

Advertising

Ad space was purchased and published weekly from October 28, to November 28, 2013 in the Turtle Island News and Two Row Times to publish a press release announcing the project along with the dates of the community engagements and final community meeting.

Newsletter comment cards were mailed to Six Nations community member's mailbox, the information included the potential benefits for the Kawennio/Gawen:yo Private School, engagement sessions, final community meeting, dates and times along with the web address and contact information.

11x17 color posters were hung throughout the community to advertise the meeting and engagement sessions.

Radio Campaign

A radio ad was composed and a press release was sent to CKRZ 100.3. The 30-second spot would inform the community members of opportunities to become involved and was read live throughout the month long engagement process.

Newsletter Comment Cards

The Newsletter comment cards provided a brief summary of the McKenzie Meadows Development Project, the potential benefits going towards Kawennio/Gaweniy Private School, a listing of the community engagement sessions, final meeting and contact information. The comment cards were created to assist the CAP team, SNEC and community advocates in creating awareness of the engagement process as well as providing opportunities to receive comments from community members.

Those who were interested in the project were supportive of the potential benefits going towards the Kawennio/Gaweniy Private School and believed that the revenues would be a benefit to the community.

It was seen as an opportunity to focus the community on imperative needs.

Those who opposed the project were concerned that the benefit amount per unit wasn't enough, concerns for housing being made available to community members, guaranteed employment for the community, land claims and archaeological concerns. There was a general uncertainty towards the development and Six Nations Elected Council's involvement in the process. The majority of the verbal comments expressed confusion in regards to court case settlements connected with the McKenzie Meadows Development.

Website – www.sixnationsfuture.com

The website was maintained and updated through the Six Nations Economic Development. The site provided all members of Six Nations with the opportunity to become educated about the project and how to become involved in the decision making process. The site also included contact information for the engagement lead and dates on all community engagements.

From October 28, 2013, to November 28, 2013, comments were received from Six Nations members as well as non-members. The non-member comments were largely concerned over wildlife, aesthetics of future roadways, communication and property values.

Comments received from Six Nations members were generally opposed to the development. There was some concern for the resurgent of Douglas Creek, environmental impacts or felt that the benefits being offered were not sufficient. There was concern that the 30-day timeline was not long enough.

Engagement Sessions

The first two community engagement sessions featured an open house concept and a town hall setting during the final community meeting. Each engagement and community meeting featured a power point slide show, large information panels, newsletter comment cards and refreshments. CAP team members in attendance handled all questions, comments and concerns.

A power point slide show included information based on the following titles:

Eleven 24 X 36 information panels were created and showcased at each engagement and the final community meeting. The information panels were created to help visually illustrate the background and development site maps for the McKenzie Meadows project. These items were very helpful in providing the community members with a visual understanding of the location and particulars of the development.

11 panels were created with information based on the following titles:

Initial Engagement Session

Tuesday November 5, 2013, 12:00 - 6:00 PM

Six Nations Tourism - Assembly Room

Attendance: 16 (8 Community members and 8 CAP team members)

General Attitude: Although there was no formal presentation made, CAP team members had individual discussions and answered any questions and concerns from those who attended this event. Participants watched the power point slide show, viewed the panels on display and enjoyed the refreshments that were made available. Questions centered around possible development housing for Six Nations members, increasing the benefits towards Kawennio/Gaweniyo Private School and the involvement of HDI and the Haudenosaunee Confederacy Chiefs Council within the process. Community members who attended this engagement session admitted to being skeptical but curious about the development.

Second Engagement Session

Saturday November 16, 2013, 10:00 -3:00 PM

Six Nations Polytechnic – Grand River Room

Attendance: 20 (12 Community members and 8 CAP team members)

General Attitude: Although there was no formal presentation, CAP team members had individual discussions and answered any questions and concerns from those who attended this event. Participants watched the power point slide show, viewed the panels on display and enjoyed the refreshments that were made available. Questions regarding additional benefits going towards the Kawennio/Gaweniyo Private School and concern over the archaeology reports, environmental impacts and the developer's connections to Douglas Creek.

Final Engagement Session - Community Meeting

Thursday November 21, 2013, 7:00 – 9:00 PM

Six Nations Community Hall

Attendance: 43 (Including 3 non community members and 8 CAP team members)

General Attitudes: Many of the attendees viewed the information panels prior to the power point presentation. With the largest attendance during the engagement process, the participants were generally vocal with concerns and personal views regarding the overall development.

An intense discussion featured Lonny Bomberly and Aaron Detlor speaking about HDI's initial involvement within the development process and the initiation and background of benefits for the Kawennio/Gaweniyo Private School.

Community members expressed a lack of community representation to make a final decision on the developments future. Although a portion of the attendees disagreed with the overall development, there were some members who acknowledged their support for the benefits and that this development process is setting a precedent.

Although the views from non-community members were inquisitive, there views were considered misinformed regarding the development process by Lonny Bomberry.

Overall Themes

Throughout the engagement process, an overall pattern of themes emerged. These themes were expressed as a result of the community's questions, discussions and comments. It is interesting to note that several community members suggested that all housing developments within the Haldimand Tract should be zoned for Six Nations members only, provide tax free housing, guarantee employment and that higher per unit benefit be sought after.

Build on Strengths

Although participants agreed that the engagement process has positive attributes, they also agree that there is much more to build upon. Additions to the process should be made, some examples included: providing Council supported seminars or workshops, utilizing social media to reach more community members and expanding the timeline during the engagement process.

Lessons Learned

Timeline: Regarding the 30-day consultation period, committing the Six Nations community to meetings and events requires an extended timeline; a suggestion of a 60-day engagement process could be more beneficial.

Advocates: The community engagement process remains a challenge within the Six Nations territory. Population, acreage, non-existent public transportation within the community can affect engagement attendance. The factions that exist within the community create challenges in communication, collaboration and the overall success of the engagement process.

One of the most successful methods used during the engagements was speaking one-on-one or in small groups of 3 to 5 people.

Future engagements should include an in-depth social media campaign, seminar or workshop sessions and round table talks regarding the consultation accommodation and economic process.

Community members act as advocates when participating in a comfortable setting rather than a political or public format. Although it can be a time consuming process, the benefits in developing personal communication would be better suited for the Six Nations community. Exploring this format could also achieve a higher success rate in future community engagements and the decision making process. Developing a new format of creating a positive atmosphere in community gatherings could inspire more advocates and increase community participation.

In order for the entire community to be truly engaged, all leaders from each faction and each group needs to agree to work together with the goal of creating a stronger community and a successful future.

Conclusion

While Six Nations Elected Council promotes transparency in all agreements, developments, land claims, territory and negotiation. With varying degrees of personal views, wariness in the political structure, traditional knowledge and social instability, it is for these reasons the community views can be at times indifference when dealing with a governmental process.

The community's questions and concerns thrive on a belief that all projects and developments on Six Nations lands needs to achieve a unified agreement that is beneficial to the entire community.

Given the current status of Six Nations members operating within factions, traditional beliefs and a diverse understanding of historic information. Conclusive research must be conducted with the goal of implementing an innovative engagement process that includes interactive seminars and or workshops that accurately reflects the community structure, voice and concerns.

As a result of questions, comments, views and concerns gathered throughout the engagement process, it is recommended that the Six Nations Elected Council not proceeding with this development.
