**New Development project to be discussed via Six Nations community engagement process**

SIX NATIONS, ON – Six Nations Elected Council (SNEC) announces a comprehensive community engagement process to determine community support for the proposed McKenzie Meadows Project.

The lands are located on the west side of McKenzie Road, South of Fuller Road in the urban area of Caledonia. The developer of the project is 2036356 Ontario Inc. , a numbered company owned by Michael Corrado and others. This two-phased residential development project will consist of a minimum of 700 residential units with a maximum of 1000. The entire land holding is approximately 107 acres, in which Phase 1 will develop 25.2 acres and 200 residential units.

“Six Nations Council holds strong in its dedication to hearing the voices from our community. The McKenzie Meadows Development Engagement Process is an integral part to hearing the voices about the benefits of this project for our community”, says Chief William Montour.

The community engagement process has been designed to share information with the Six Nations community about the financial, economic, and environmental impact and benefits associated with the project, and provides a community wide mechanism to gather feedback that will help guide the SNEC.

The SNEC community engagement process will run from October 28<sup>th</sup> to November 28<sup>th</sup>, 2013; the community meetings are scheduled to occur on November 5<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>. The community meetings will provide further information and will include the opportunity for community members to have one-on-one discussions with staff.
