Comment: I am in favour of the arrangement with Hydro One.

Comment: Solar farms: point to be considered: windmills in SW ON (near Grand Bend) paint is failing on the towers- painting contractors are being consulted to bid on fixing them. The base is in 3 parts and the paint has failed where they are connected (a section- 10-20 feet) which is going to be very costly to repair- has to be taken apart (lain down) sand blasted and done properly.
