## Niagara Reinforcement Line -Project Summary-

The Niagara Reinforcement Line (NRL), a 76 KM transmission line, has been sitting near completion yet unconnected for over 10 years. The project's final connection point is the Middleport Transformer station – which requires routing along the Highway 6 bypass in Caledonia, ON.

A three-phase bundled solution, to **ENERGIZE**, **ACQUIRE**, and **OPTIMIZE** the Niagara Reinforcement Line, has been proposed by Six Nations of the Grand River Development Corporation (SNGRDC) to the Ministry of Energy (ENERGY) and Hydro One Networks Inc. (Hydro One). The project is being presented to the Six Nations Community for a period of 60 days (Oct 16-Dec 15, 2017).

### What is the Three-Phase Bundle Solution? \*

#### 1. **ENERGIZE** the Niagara Reinforcement Line

- Hydro One has committed to offering a contract opportunity to A6N Utilities (A6N), to complete the remaining construction of the line using local First Nation skilled trades people.

#### 2. **ACQUIRE** Interest in the Niagara Reinforcement Line

- SNGRDC will purchase up to 25% ownership interest in the line. Financing will be supported through an Aboriginal Loan Guarantee from the Ontario Finance Authority, resulting in a lower cost of capital

#### 3. **OPTIMIZE** to create New Renewable Development Opportunities

- ENERGY will set aside 300 MW of future renewable energy development for SNGRDC to develop within in the next 15 years, in the Haldimand County, Brant County, Niagara Region and/or Hamilton Region, with connect points to either the NRL or the Nanticoke Line.
