RE: Oneida Energy Storage Project

I am writing today with a good mind as a follow up to your communication from February 16, 2021, directing us to reach out to HDI regarding the Oneida Energy Storage Project. I can confirm that we have written to the HDI on two separate occasions on February 22, 2021 and again on March 9, 2021 – unfortunately, we have not had a response.

As shared in our previous communications, Six Nations of the Grand River Development Corporation (SNGRDC) launched a community commentary period to review the merits of the proposed Oneida Energy Storage Project. These sessions have now concluded, and a final report is in the process of being developed, which we will share with you and make public once it is completed.

The purpose of this letter is to directly outline our ideas on how we can collaborate with the HCCC in a meaningful way. With this in mind, we have developed the following thoughts for consideration:

- Invitation for HCCC to provide name offerings for the project;
- Annual funding of \$25,000 to pursue cultural/language/environmental initiatives developed or directed by HCCC; and
- Invitation for HCCC to participate in a ribbon cutting and media event should the project advance.

We are open to further dialogue on the project as we believe Oneida Energy Storage represents a unique opportunity to demonstrate community-wide support for a project with significant environmental benefits.

Last, we feel it is important for SNGRDC to continue to engage with HCCC on this and future projects; we believe doing so will help achieve new levels of social harmony and mutual appreciation for all members of our community.
