RE: Notice of Community Investment of Hagersville Battery Energy Storage Park

In an effort to remain transparent with the Six Nations of the Grand River Elected Council (SNGREC), I am writing to inform you of an upcoming community comment period for the proposed Hagersville Battery Energy Storage Park (Project) scheduled for October 23<sup>rd</sup> to November 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

The intent of the comment period is to remain accountable and transparent to the Six Nations of the Grand River Community on investments pursued by Six Nations of the Grand River Development Corporation (SNGRDC). As the Project has recently secured a contract from the Independent Electricity System Operator (IESO), we have reached a point in development where we would like to update the Six Nations Community on the Project. The Project provides a key need to the IESO grid by storing electricity during off-peak hours, when intermittent renewable generation is high, and then providing electricity during peak hours, when electricity demand is high.

SNGRDC and our partner Boralex Inc. would like to invite the SNGREC and its members to the community information session being held on October 30<sup>th</sup> from 5-7pm at the SNGRDC Boardroom located at 2498 Chiefswood Road. Should SNGREC wish to have SNGRDC present at another date during the public comment period, we would be happy to accommodate that request.

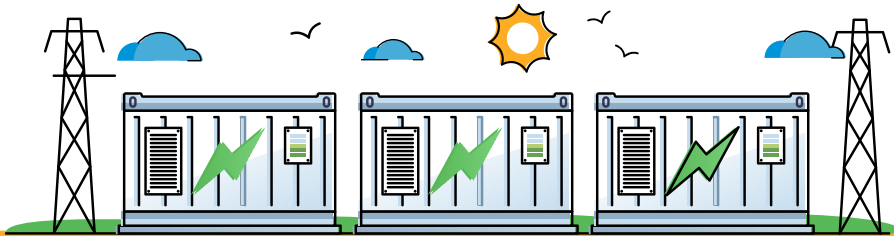

Construction phase will create 200 jobs with a focus on local employment

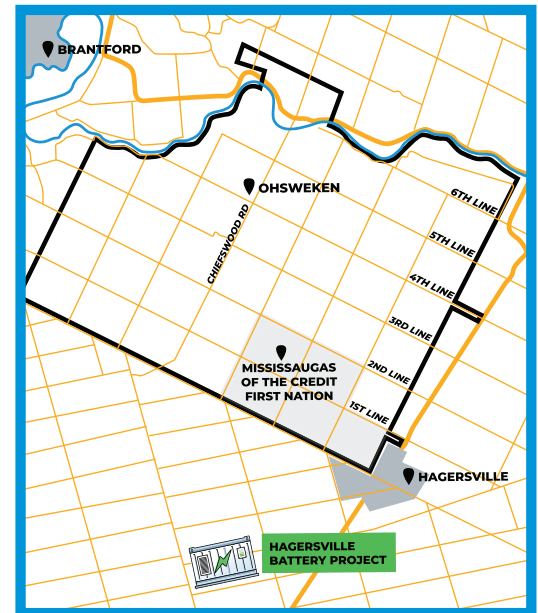

## PROJECT INFORMATION

**PROJECT CAPACITY:** 300 MW

**OWNERSHIP STRUCTURE:**

- SNRDC will have 50% ownership
- Equity financing available from Boralex Inc.

**PROJECT LOCATION:** HAGERSVILLE, ONTARIO

- Hagersville Project will be located at the Hagersville Business Park on approximately 15 acres of land
- Project is near the intersection of Concession 10 Walpole and Haldimand Road 55
- Outside of Haldimand Tract

**OTHER INFORMATION:**

- Will utilize lithium ion storage technology that are designed to meet the National Fire Code of Canada; designed to pass evolving safety tests prior to operation
- Technical environmental assessments are currently underway and must meet Ontario standards for permitting approval
- The Hagersville Project will have an interconnection line connecting to the Nanticoke transmission corridor
- Will help meet the energy capacity need identified by Ontario's Independent Electrical System Operator (IESO)
